Suggestions and strategies to support transitions

Shared by practitioners

- Post a welcome card to each child to help them feel excited and valued before joining the setting.
- Welcome parents and carers to coffee meetings each term.
- Support smooth transitions by having key workers spend time in the child's current room before they move to a new one.
- Visit children who have transitioned to school in the Autumn term.
- Send a video of the Key Person reading a story and share activities based on the child's interests.
